LHS efforts result in creation of Museum

For many, many years a number of Lakewood residents thought there was a great deal of value in preserving the history of the Lakewood area. After all, a great deal of history occurred in what is today's City of Lakewood.

However, despite the interest among individuals, some new to the community and a number of them among the city's pioneer families, nothing came of the oft-spoken desire – until 10 years ago.

With the incorporation of the City of Lakewood, came a renewed interest in establishing a local repository for the area's history and so, finally, the Lakewood Historical Society was formally organized.

In the 10 years since the organization came into existence there has been considerable progress toward the goal of creating a meaningful place to gather, preserve and display the history and artifacts of the area.

Since its formation only a decade ago, the Lakewood Historical Society has accomplished the following:

• Opened a storefront museum in the Lakewood Colonial Center;

• Produced monthly programs on the area's history:

• Created a website that provides historical information and updates viewers on local events and attractions;

• Produced a regular newsletter for the benefit of Lakewood Historical Society members and to provide information to others;

Developed a membership base for the society;
Agreed to establish a permanent home for the museum

Now, with all these accomplishments during the 10 years of effort, the Lakewood Historical Society is ready to celebrate the decade of progress and formally announce the location of the site for the permanent museum.

Becky Huber, Society president, said plans are underway for a communitywide event Oct. 16 at the McGavick Student Center on the Clover Park Technical College campus. Coincidently, the new home for the museum will be the historic Mueller-Harkins Hangar building on the college campus.

The celebration will

include special recognition of charter members, book signing of "Images of America: Lakewood" by co-authors Walter Neary and Steve Dunkelberger, and a slide show of the many Lakewood historical sites. Additional activities and participants are still being finalized, according to Huber.

The public is invited to the free event that will get underway at 7 pm.

The site for the permanent museum of the Lakewood Historical Society is the Mueller-Harkins Hangar on what is today the Clover Park Technical College campus on Steilacoom Boulevard.

Becky Huber, Society president, said the site was selected by the board of directors following a lengthy process of researching a number of potential locations. BCRA, a Tacoma architectural and engineering consulting firm, provided in-depth analysis of several of the prospects and recommended the hangar site to the society.

The Clover Park Technical College grounds was at one

stage a general aviation airport, a US Navy facility and also the home of a nationally-known auto race track. The race track is gone and the runway that provided small, private planes access to the hangar, has also been eliminated. However, the hangar, located just south of Steilacoom Boulevard, survives. Over the years it has served a variety of purposes for the school as well as others. Today, it houses some carpenter training programs.

Huber said the building has numerous features that made it especially attractive to the society as a permanent museum home. Among those aspects making it a logical site is its proximity to a major street, its size and both the willingness and interest of college officials in housing the museum on the campus and cooperating in the museum development.

The hangar contains 13,000 square feet of space usable for display and meeting rooms. The solid historical background in the community is another positive feature, according to Huber. An agreement for the long term use of the building is currently in the works as is a plan for raising the funds that will be necessary to finance the upgrading of the building. BCRA is also developing a cost estimate to go along with the schematic for the building.
